III. Working Group Updates

<u>Local Agency Outreach – Travis Kinney</u>

Still moving along with introduction to bridge preservation training for local agencies. Planning presentation with Virginia DOT currently. Currently working on an initiative to push out information regarding the regional meetings to see if we can get more local agency involvement. Off-system bridge funding from the BFP of the IIJA is bringing more funding than usual to local agencies, and the group is looking into how local agencies are incorporating these funds.

Bridge Deck Preservation – Chris Keegan

Looking to start May 1st. Michigan State has taken on the sealer setting task, which should be finished in December, and the work will be completed within the \$20,000 budget. Sarah Sondag is working on putting together a peer exchange on decks. Sarah may be reaching out to present on the projects at the next meeting.

Q&A

Andrew B: You say surface prep is pressure washing, but water activates the product. How long do you recommend the surface be allowed to dry before application?

Mario: Good question. The area should be visually dry. You don't need to measure the humidity levels in the concrete. The product starts to penetrate when it is applied and penetrates deeper

with water and continues to penetrate over days. Moisture within the concrete can evaporate while the sealer.

Additionally, the 25-year lifespan helps ensure that owners aren't continually sealing their bridges and have time to address other structures before coming back.

Peter Seibert: Does the Alchemco gel remain watertight when the crack is located in the tension zone esp. in the negative moment area of the bridge?

Mario: What happens is the product will penetrate about ³/₄" into the crack in the concrete, and then we apply water, causing the gel to form and expand. Depending on the width of the crack, it may take a bit longer to seal the crack. Without water, the gel shrinks. If water is applied to the gel again, the gel will swell again. The gel will prevent water intrusion up to 1400 ft of water pressure.

Chris Higgins: Can the product be applied vertically?

Mario: Yes. We had a project in 2017 on a concrete dry dock where a product with the same technology was successfully applied vertically.

Jarrod Plummer: How does it perform with deicers (magnesium chloride)?

Mario: The product is resistant to a number of chemicals, including deicing agents.

Chris Keegan: We've used this product in Washington, and we like the 25-year life. We did learn that the product doesn't work on painted surfaces.

Mario: That is correct. The product won't penetrate the concrete if it is coated.

Andrew Blower: Are there any issues with freeze-thaw, abrasion, salt scaling? **Mario**: No, and this product will also not impact the skid resistance of the concrete.
